Dear New 4th Graders AND Parents,

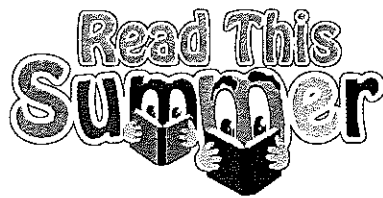
